We ended up losing to Jackson but I think that was the wake up call he and the team needed. The next match at Timken Aaron lead the team with a 237 - 259 = 496 series to shoot a season high 2782. He then turned around on Wednesday against St. Thomas to shoot a very fine 300 the first game and a 248 the second game to lead us to a new season high of 2856.

Aaron has been on the varsity squad for since his Freshman year. He was second team all SCHSBC last season with a 210 average. After this week of bowling he is now up to a 220 average and competing for top average in the conference.
